


Los mamiferos y sus caracteristicas • Les mammifères et leurs caractéristiques Oct. 5: AMNH Animal Adaptations Scavenger Day

Campers will follow one of three possible hunts leveled to their group. Some hunts will take them all over the museum, but our main area of focus is the Hall of North American Mammals, where we will learn about some of the adaptations animals have developed for




survival. We are focusing specifically on teeth, paws/hooves,
